- ✓ Speak with adults who have careers that interest you
- \checkmark Make reading and writing a priority always work to improve your skills
- ✓ Take Algebra I to be able to take advanced math courses in high school

9TH GRADE: PLAN

- ✓ Challenging courses advanced math, English, science, and foreign language
- ✓ Create a plan for the next 4 years
- ✓ Join clubs, sports, and volunteer organizations that interest you
- ✓ Research careers that sound interesting to you and those in emerging markets
- ✓ Begin your high school resume keep track of all awards, honors, and activities
- ✓ Get good grades your GPA begins the first day of your freshman year
- ✓ Take the PSAT to get a baseline score (October)

- ✓ Take the PSAT to compete for National Merit Scholarship (October)

- ✓ Research the required ACT and SAT scores for colleges you are interested in
- ✓ Prepare for the SAT and ACT with a professional
- Take the SAT and ACT multiple times to get your best score (and superscore)
